Framework

Legislative powers of the Senate

- Section 53 (same as House, but the purse strings remain with the Executive)
- Section 51 areas of legislative jurisdiction
- Senate's standing orders (routine of business)

Case study 1: The Marriage bill

- The Senate's consideration
 - Extra time
 - A conscience vote
 - Introduced the day the postal vote declared
 - Select Committee
 - collegiate and co-ordinated
 - no recommendations but areas of consensus
 - A bill primed for success

Case study 2: the tampon tax

The GST

- A broad base tax with exemptions
- Intergovernmental Agreement on Federal Financial Relations
- debate question put
- Estimates questions
- Minister for Health makes determination

Case study 3: the Home Affairs bill

- An unremarkable bill
- A bill repackaged as amendments
- An alteration to the routine of business and the votes
- House consideration constitutional issue
- Further Senate consideration
- Senate committee inquiry

The role of the Senate
