# Use of Civic Technology

## What is it?

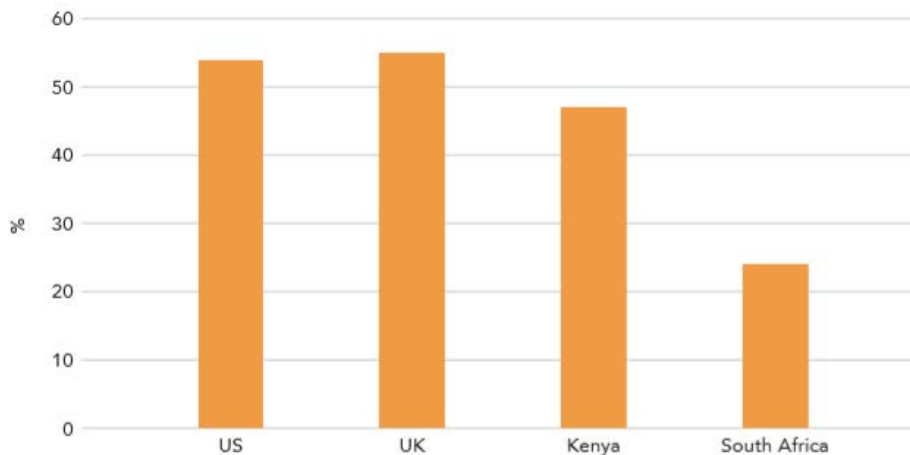
- ▶ Enables citizen participation and engagement
- ▶ Facilitates political exchange
- ▶ Enhances citizen powered democracy
- ▶ Allows disadvantaged groups to participate in e-democracy



# Possible Issues with use

- ▶ Entrenches disadvantage for people unable to use the internet?
- ▶ Greater state power over citizens?
- ▶ A platform for those already politically informed?

## Citizen Deliberation Software

- ▶ E-petitions, surveys and online communities where debates take place on policy and budgets
- ▶ Improving trust in the legitimacy of political institutions

# Changes in the NSW Legislative Assembly

- ▶ Currently livestreams parliamentary proceedings
- ▶ Proposed e-petitions
- ▶ Public Question during Question Time, may give MPs opportunity to digitally engage communities



# iVote Issues in NSW

- ▶ Online remote voting platform for NSW state elections
- ▶ In 2015, researchers identified flaws in iVote:
  - Could be used to modify votes without detection
- ▶ During the 2019 election:
  - Site crashed and many unable to vote



# Cyber Security Attacks

- ▶ Attempts by foreign powers to infiltrate elections and governments:
  - Australian federal election in 2019
  - UK Parliament in 2017
  - US election in 2016
  - French election in 2017





# A Challenge to Democracy?

- ▶ Foreign actors manipulate democracy through cyber attacks
- ▶ Civic tech can create the façade of citizen powered democracy
  - Moscow's Active Citizen Platform
